Medical Camps Held

With support from PKSF the Uplifting the Quality of the Lives of the Elderly People Program of SSS organized a free eye camp at Hugra Union Parishad under Beguntal Branch, Tangail on 29 January 2023. A total of 102 patients got free medical treatment from the camp. On the other hand, under the initiative of ENRICH program of SSS two medical camps on the dermatological and venereal diseases were held at Dyenna Union Parishad Compound and Dyenna Government Primary School in Tangail on 14 and 15 March 2023 respectively. From the camps, 202 individuals got free medical treatment.

In the camps, specialized doctors, members of the Union Parishad, local dignitaries, staff members of ENRICH, NEM and the Elderly People Programs of SSS and others were present.

Now-a-days, microfinance: one of the greatest sectors of our country flows up a transaction of Tk. 900-1000 crore per day, and annually about Tk. 2 lack 25 thousand crore, which amount is approximately one-third of our national budget as well. Concurrently, there are 3.50 crore clients with their annual savings of Tk. 60-70 thousand in this sector, in where 91 percent of the clients is female [Info: MRA]. Microfinance sector brings about thousands of self and wageemployments through financial and technical supports, which foster the utilization of resources and opportunities properly of our country, and reduce unemployment, increase assets and living standards and establish empowerment at the grassroots.

Micro-finance Institutions (MIFs), the envoy of the development and humanity, need necessary collaborations from national and international levels, particularly- skilled manpower creation, fund supply at a nominal cost and reformation of microfinance friendly principle and policies are urgently required.

SSS by the Heavy Cold Weather Affected People

Society for Social Service (SSS) provided grant to the helpless and underprivileged people suffering from bitter cold weather across the country. A total of 52,069 beneficiaries under 55 branches of 07 zones and 5,673 staff members of the organization at the field-level and 1,350 people (through different district administrations and other media) received Tk. 5,90,92,000 (Tk. 1,000 per head) as grant money.

Recently, bitter cold weather has brought extensive miseries and adversities to the people living in different regions of the country, especially--the poor and vulnerable people of the north-west region. According to the direction, the affected clients under 55 branches of the organization in Bogura, Natore, Rangpur, Jashore, Jamalpur, Mymensingh and Faridpur districts, mostly affected by the cold weather, were selected to provide grant of Tk. 1,000 per head.

Mentioned, SSS, under the disaster management, relief and rehabilitation program, takes initiative to provide financial and other support to the people affected by natural disasters like: flood, bitter cold, cyclone, drought, and so on every year. The welfare and development-friendly activities of SSS help the underprivileged people keep their income generating activities active, which helps them escape from the poverty cycle.

Besides, the delegation visited a demonstration farm of insects used as chicken feeds, run by a beneficiary in the village Bamanhata of Bhuapur. At the same time, they looked into a poultry collection center of an entrepreneur in the local market of Bhuapur at 12 pm.

At 3 pm, the delegates took part in a view-sharing meeting with the executive director of SSS at his office, Tangail. In the meeting, the different activities of SSS and the progress of the PACE program as well as the marketing of Kadaknath and indigenous chicken were put into discussion.
